

Notes on East Harbor:

Best are 220, 219 and 218 give direct access to Glacial Grooves and those paths.

The sites on the Red Bird (lakeside) trail are much more private than the rest of the park. The problem is that trail access is almost non-existent. The trails have access smack dab in the middle of a site. You would have to walk directly through a site to get to the access.

153 is right next to Red Bird Trail but is part of the exit.

208 for seclusion and shade will be muddy.

About the only potable water is at the dump.

UPDATE October 23, 2024

Camped on level pull-through site 222 which has direct access to paths. It is a great site Although it, like most sites, would be muddy in the rain. It is also spot on for evening sun So if it is hot, maybe look to the A part under the canopy.
